Many students are transitioning from our current program without completing the current HSW 230 course, because they currently have professions in the field. Because they are already working professionals in the field, students are not interested, or able, to complete the 180-field placement experience. To encourage degree completion, the program has developed an alternative learning opportunity for students actively working in the field of helping (paid or unpaid). Students who able to demonstrate current work in the field are approved to complete the HSW 235 class rather than complete the HSW 230 class. This one credit class will require that students are actively working in the field. Students will be applying theoretical lenses to their current employment, elevating their learning experience while also working on composing an APA style research paper.

Also, upon reviewing the catalog description, there is still reference to an admission process. We removed the admission process when we added the HSW 229 class several years ago.

## **University Transfer Programs**

## Human Services (AAHUST)

#### Associate in Arts Degree

#### Program Effective Term: Fall 2006

This program prepares students for a job as a substance abuse, hospice, case, psychiatric, or social services aide in settings such as schools, rehabilitation centers, and mental health clinics or as a staff member in a community/neighborhood center. The program provides skills students will need to work on a one-to-one basis or in groups to help people cope with problems. The program also prepares students to transfer to a bachelor's degree program where they will continue developing skills for a career in the field of social work. The program transfers to Eastern Michigan University and Madonna University. Specific course requirements for EMU and Madonna are listed in the footnotes. For more details, copies of the articulation agreements may be obtained from the counseling office or a program advisor.

#### Articulation:

This program has articulation agreements with the following institutions:

- Eastern Michigan University, College of Health and Human Services, Bachelor of Arts or Science in Social Work. Students should meet with an EMU Department of Social Work advisor before applying for admission to EMU's program.

- Madonna University, College of Social Sciences, BSW in Social Work

- Meets MACRAO plus EMU's and Madonna's additional requirements. Students must have their transcripts certified for MACRAO completion by the WCC Student Records Office.

#### Applying for Admission to the Program

The faculty and administration reserve the right to admit and retain only those students who, in their judgment, possess academic and personal suitability for the Human Services Program. Suitability criteria are listed below and also can be found in the Human Services Student Handbook.

Applications to the program must be made during the semester that students are enrolled in HSW 100 (Introduction to Human Services). Interested students who are enrolled in the course will be invited to submit a written request for an admission interview.

#### Program Admission Requirements:

Applicants must have the following minimum COMPASS scores or complete the equivalent courses:

-COMPASS Algebra score of 46 or MTH 097 with a "C" or better -College Level COMPASS scores in reading and writing. Applicants must enroll in HSW 100 and complete the course with a grade of "C" or better.

Applicants must meet the following suitability criteria:

- Has a cumulative GPA of 2.0 in all WCC courses

- Demonstrates honesty in dealings with other students and faculty
- Demonstrates behavior conforming to the National Organization for Human Service Education's "Ethical Standards of Human Service Professionals" (printed in the program handbook)
- Presents in an appropriate and professional manner in the interview
- Demonstrates evidence of being able to relate to clients in a helpful manner
- Applicants must submit a letter of recommendation from a nonfamily member who knows them well such as a minister, employer, or teacher.

#### Continuing Eligibility Requirements:

Students must demonstrate basic computer literacy skills by successfully passing the Computer and Information Literacy Test. The test may be taken at any point during the program, but must be completed before graduating.

Faculty will review students' eligibility for the program on an ongoing basis.

1. Students must maintain satisfactory academic class performance, as evidenced by a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0.

2. Students must earn a "C" or better in all HSW courses.

- 3. To enroll in the Human Services field internships, students must have completed HSW 100, HSW 150, and HSW 200 with a "C" or better.
- 4. Students must maintain at least an 80% rate of attendance in class and in an internship placement.
- 5. Students must honor any agreement entered into with an agency serving as an internship site.
- 6. Students must maintain ethical behavior as defined in the National Organization for Human Service Education's "Ethical Standards of Human Services Professionals."
- 7. Students should be aware that internship sites might conduct background checks on applicants to determine if they have been convicted of a crime or are addicted to drugs or alcohol.

## Human Services Transfer Track May 15,1998

## A. Justification for Program Track:

The vast majority of current and past students in the Human Services Program report that they want to transfer to a senior-level college and receive a bachelor's degree. This new program track will meet that significant need. This new track gives students the opportunity to receive an Associate in Arts Degree plus fulfill transfer requirements and program requirements at senior-level colleges.

#### B. Cost Analysis:

There is no additional cost associated with this program because students in this track will utilize existing courses. No new courses need to be developed.

#### **C. Enrollment Projections**

Total enrollment in HSW 100 for fall and winter semesters of 1997-98 was 94 students. HSW 100 is the initial Human Services course and has been an effective indicator for future enrollment. Projected enrollment for the next several years is approximately 90 students per year.

## D. Course Descriptions of New Courses Developed for Track

No new courses were developed for the Human Services Transfer Track. All of the existing specialty courses in the base program have been accepted for transfer by Eastern Michigan University. The only courses added for this track are support courses. Existing courses that meet the Michigan Association of College Registrars and Admissions Officers (MACROA) Transfer Agreement have been substituted for the support courses in the career entry track.

## E. Analysis of Affected Instructional Units

This new track represents several changes in support courses, in the instructional units of English, Biology, and Sociology. A small but positive impact will occur with these departmental courses with a slight increase in enrollment.

## F. Licensure/Accreditation (if applicable)

The Human Services instructors are members of the National Organization of Human Service Educators (N.O.H.S.E.) and its affiliate, the Council for Standards in Human Service Education (C.S.H.S.E.). The curriculum and internship program has been set following the guidelines established by C.S.H.S.E. The instructors anticipate applying for formal program approval in three to five years.

In September 1997, the Human Services instructors applied to the Social Work Board of Examiners of the State of Michigan to have the Human Services program approved for fulfilling the requirements for the Social Work Technician registration. This approval would qualify program students to easily obtain this level of certification upon completion of the program. To date we are waiting to hear from the Board.

The department is currently applying for Michigan State Board of Education approval which will make the program and certain students eligible for financial assistance through Perkins funds.

## G. Articulations

The Human Services faculty have successfully negotiated an articulation agreement with the Social Work program at Eastern Michigan University. Plans are underway to also articulate this program to Madonna University, Wayne State University, and Marygrove College.
