Completed and signed applications must be submitted to the Health and Second Tier Admissions Office in the Student Welcome Center, located on the second floor of the Student Center Building during the dates indicated on the application.

Requirement After Acceptance

Upon acceptance, students must purchase an account from a college-designated vendor to obtain a criminal background check and to track their health records. The criminal background check and health records must be submitted to the designated vendor. Specific information regarding the college-designated vendor, health records, and deadline dates will be included in the program acceptance letter and/or provided at the mandatory orientation session.

There is mandatory attendance at the new student orientation session upon acceptance into the program. Students who do not make admission but are given alternate candidate status will be required to attend orientation to be eligible to move to accepted status if a seat becomes available.

Program Admission Requirements:

WCC uses a competitive admission process for high demand programs in health care. Each year, approximately 100 students are accepted to the program; please see the application packet for the number of seats available each term. There are multiple requirements that must be completed prior to submitting an application for admission. Students with two WCC NUR course failures or withdrawals in failing status are not eligible to apply to this program. Applicants are required to meet all admission criteria and will be ranked based on a point system. The best qualified applicants will be selected for admission to the program. Student residency will be a weighted factor in the process. Regarding the new NUR 288 course which is replacing NUR 248 and NUR 258. Please update the APNURS and APNURL programs by removing NUR 248 (5 credits) and 258 (3 credits) and replacing them with NUR 288 (8 credits) <u>effective Fall 2018.</u>

As you know, NUR 248 and NUR 258 were never taught. In the process of working through the new nursing curriculum, it became clear that it would be more effective to have one, 8 credit course, than two courses. This change was approved by the Curriculum & Assessment Committees. Because of the circumstances, it is not necessary to submit program changes for those two programs.

In response to your inquiry about NUR 248, 258 and 288. NUR 248 and 258 were the course that were proposed for the 2017-2018 Nursing program change. They were scheduled to be taught in the 4th semester (WI19). Prior to registration, they recognized that the format for 248/258 wasn't going to work well. They asked to create a new course (NUR 288) which was developed and approved to replace these two courses. Because NUR 248 and 258 were never taught, we did not build course equivalencies in the systems or add them to your course change list.

However, we should have made sure that you were aware of the change so that you could update the degree audit system. I am waiting for the course inactivations to be submitted for NUR 248 and NUR 258 and then they will be removed from the web.

Find your place in the growing field of health care. The School of Nursing and Health Sciences provides a variety of programs designed to prepare the student for entry-level positions in dental assisting, pharmacy technology, physical therapist assistant, radiography, nursing assistant or professional nursing. The health care foundations certificate provides a starting point for prospective nursing and health science students or provides the general education courses to move from completion of a certificate program into an associate degree program.

Washtenaw Community College offers programs at several levels for students who want to begin new careers, or advance in their existing careers. The first level is the certificate, which can vary from nine to thirty-six credits, depending on the field. Certificates generally prepare students for entry-level jobs.

After completing a certificate, students can progress to the next level, the advanced certificate. The credit hours required for these programs also vary. This type of certificate provides a more specialized level of skill development, and often allows students to upgrade their positions at their places of employment.

The next level, an Associate in Applied Science, is available for some programs. For some career fields, it is possible to earn a certificate, an advanced certificate, and an Associate in Applied Science degree in the same field. 



'UNDER CONSTRUCTION'

This program prepares students for the National Council Licensure Examination for Registered Nurses and for challenging and exciting jobs in all settings of health care, from the hospital to home care. Students will gain proficiency in technical aspects of nursing care, such as medication administration, treatments and procedures, and use of medical technology, and they will receive personal satisfaction from their ability to make a difference in someone's life and health. Students will also earn credits that transfer to area RN-BSN completion programs.

Applying for Admission to the Program

A total of eighty (80) students are admitted each year. Admission to the program is based on:

- Completion and submission of an application for admission to the nursing program.
- Completion of program admission requirements (see below for specific courses)
- Cumulative GPA of required courses

- Overall cumulative high school GPA or college GPA if the student has completed 12 or more college credits; must be a minimum of 2.5

- Residency status (Washtenaw County residents are given priority)

Program Admission Requirements:

Applicants must have completed:

- HSC 101 minimum grade "B-"
- BIO 111 minimum grade "B-"
- One year of high school algebra, minimum COMPASS Algebra score of 46, or MTH 097 minimum grade "C+"
- current Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA) state certification

Applicants must successfully pass the pre-admission math test with a minimum score of 80 percent

Admission to the Nursing program is contingent upon students declaring that they have specific physical and cognitive abilities. These requirements are detailed in the Nursing program admission packet, which can be obtained from the Office of Admissions. WCC reserves the right to request that students successfully demonstrate the specific cognitive and physical abilities related to the Nursing program.

All students must demonstrate proficiency in the English language prior to placement in clinical courses. Please refer to admission packet for further details.

Continuing Eligibility Requirements:

-Students must demonstrate basic computer literacy skills by successfully passing the Computer and Information Literacy Test. The test may be taken at any point during the program, but must be completed before graduating. - Program courses are sequential and complemented with appropriate support courses. All courses must be completed with a grade of "C-" or better if taken at WCC, or to receive transfer credit with a grade of 2.0 or higher, in order to graduate from this program.

- Students are required to adhere to rules of the Nursing Code of Ethics published in the Nursing Program Student Handbook.

- Students should be aware that the Michigan Board of Nursing may deny a license to an applicant who has been convicted of a crime or is addicted to drugs or alcohol.

- Students in the Nursing program will be required to purchase special uniforms and supplies throughout the duration of the program.

- Students are required to submit health records annually, while in the program.
